Monday May 22nd Recovering our Rivers: where are we, what next, how can we all get involved? Jamie Audsley HWT Plus JABA AGM. 7 for 7.30pm The Barrels (back room)

Jamie Audsley, the new CEO of Herefordshire Wildlife Trust, will be talking about the crisis of our rivers, including The Wye. Come along from 7pm for a drink and cake for a short AGM at 7.30 followed by Jamie's talk around 8pm. Balsam Bash at Bishop's Meadow Sat. May 27th 10.30 - 12.30

Last year Jaba took on the task of trying to make a difference to our local stretch of river and took up the job of clearing the riverbanks at Bishops Meadow, of Himalayan balsam. We held regular Saturday morning 'bashes ' from May – September which we'll be starting again on May 27th. Bring gardening gloves and meet at Bishop's Meadow by Victoria Bridge at 10.30pm. Balsam pulls up easily, root and all. Twist off the root and leave the plant on the ground to rot. Himalayam balsam is an invasive non- native species (INNS) It is the tallest, densest, fastest - growing UK annual, growing up to 3 metres tall. Each plant can produce up to 1500 seeds, dispersed and shot up to 7m away! It

forms a barrier to accessing the river, reducing visibility and safety along the riverbank. It smothers other species and causes soil erosion, resulting in mud and silt being washed into the river. See www.wyevalleyaonb.org.uk for more information on INNS including a downloadable balsam toolkit.

David joined the team as Treasurer in 2017 and has been a committed member of Jaba eversince, serving as Chair from 2020. He has been a regular supporter of Jaba's balsam initiative at Bishop's Meadow. We are very glad that he and Jane will continue to be members of the Jaba team. Meanwhile Jaba is in need of a Chair.
